# Our Journey

FullFibre Limited was formed in 2017 by three directors who are passionate about fibre and its opportunities. They all believe in both the importance of consumer choice and the role of fibre connectivity in unlocking social mobility and economic growth. These reasons are largely why the business delivers only wholesale networks, choosing to focus on rapidly scaling FullFibre's network footprint whilst allowing multiple ISPs and network operators to provide services to consumers.

The company focuses on the underserved market towns of the UK. Other fibre providers have forgotten these areas as they centre their attention on the larger urban cities, which means there is little to no competition from other providers in these underserved areas. FullFibre's infrastructure aims to revitalise businesses and drive economic growth, especially in the regions where the national lockdown had the most impact.

"Covid has changed the world. People no longer want to live in crowded cities only to commute every day on the tube or live further out and waste precious time sitting in traffic; they want to work from home.

We've seen bandwidth usage go through the roof, and we've seen copper networks creaking at the edges. People want and should be able to work in these smaller towns that have been left behind.

Fibre infrastructure, for us, is the equivalent of what would have been invested in railway or road links in the past."
